A BILL

To prohibit the use of Federal funds to provide or subsidize housing for aliens who are unlawfully present in the United States until the Secretary of Veterans determines that sufficient Federal resources exist to provide housing assistance to all homeless veterans.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Heroes Over Aliens
- 5 Act" or the "HOA Act".

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1	SEC. 2. LIMITATION ON USE OF FUNDS TO HOUSE ALIENS	
2	UNLAWFULLY PRESENT IN THE UNITED	
3	STATES UNTIL SUFFICIENT FEDERAL RE-	
4	SOURCES EXIST TO PROVIDE HOUSING AS-	
5	SISTANCE TO ALL HOMELESS VETERANS.	
6	(a) Funding Limitation.—Except as provided	
7	under subsection (b), no Federal funds may be used to	
8	provide or subsidize housing for aliens who are unlawfully	
9	present in the United States until the date on which the	
10	Secretary of Veterans Affairs submits to Congress the de-	
11	termination described in subsection (c).	
12	(b) Exclusions.—The limitation described in sub-	
13	section (a) does not apply to any aliens who are—	
14	(1) in the custody of, or being detained by, the	
15	Department of Homeland Security; or	
16	(2) incarcerated in a Federal prison or in any	
17	prison, institution, or facility receiving funding from	
18	the Federal Government.	
19	(c) Determination Described.—The determina-	
20	tion described in this subsection is a determination by the	
21	Secretary of Veterans Affairs that, based on the most re-	
22	cent point-in-time count data available from the Depart-	
23	ment of Housing and Urban Development, sufficient Fed-	
24	eral resources exist to provide housing assistance to all	
25	veterans who are homeless or experiencing homelessness.	

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- 1 (d) Considerations.—In making the determination
- 2 described in subsection (c), the Secretary of Veterans Af-
- 3 fairs shall consider the criteria and benchmarks described
- 4 in the document entitled "Criteria and Benchmarks for
- 5 Achieving the Goal of Ending Veteran Homelessness"
- 6 (Version 4, June 2019) published by the United States
- 7 Interagency Council on Homelessness.
- 8 (e) Definition of Veteran.—In this section, the
- 9 term "veteran" has the meaning given that term in section
- 10 101 of title 38, United States Code.
