1	"(2) Able-bodied adult defined.—In this
2	subsection the term 'able-bodied adult' means any
3	individual who is not—
4	"(A) under 18 years of age or over 65
5	years of age;
6	"(B) medically certified as physically or
7	mentally unfit for employment;
8	"(C) pregnant;
9	"(D) the primary parent or caretaker of a
10	dependent child under 6 years of age;
11	"(E) the primary parent or caretaker of a
12	dependent child with a serious medical condi-
13	tion or disability, as determined by the State
14	agency established or designated to administer
15	or supervise the administration of the State
16	plan;
17	"(F) receiving unemployment compensa-
18	tion under State or Federal law and, as applica-
19	ble, complying with work requirements under
20	such State or Federal law; or
21	"(G) participating in a drug or alcohol
22	treatment and rehabilitation program (as de-
23	fined in section 3(h) of the Food and Nutrition
24	Act of 2008).".
